The village of Clinton Falls was laid out in the fall of 1855 by Dr W W Finch. In the village plat a block was pl to everyone. It was not laid out in lots until after Dr Finch left. In 1882 the Oak Hill Cemetery Association was deeded the block to them and then was platted into lots.

This was the first cemetery in Steele County. The first burial was Daniel Morrison who died in March 1856. Hi the following June and is buried beside her husband in the same cemetery.

This cemetery is located in Clinton Falls township in section 20 on top of the hill over looking the I 35 interstat woods.

Just drive into Clinton Falls village and then drive west on the street north of the old town hall and follow the s around west to the cemetery.

The cemetery is drained, mowed and well maintained. Most markers were found in good repair. The Oak Hill c used to expand on the 1985 record and are recorded here as the exact layout of the cemetery stating with row 1

His most desired wish was to be buried in the Children's Cemetery here at the State Public School for Depender Children in Owatonna. Fredrick Berndt was returned and buried here Wednesday November 2 1995. In his you home.

Initiated by Harvey and Maxine Ronglien, they are grateful to all who contributed to this project.

There are three markers in granite inscribed, the south marker with bronze inscription reads: There are many ... During my 11 years at the Owatonna State Public School, these hills were alive with energetic children and ran Ages ranged from birth to 18 years. Almost every day children would be placed out on terms of indentures, oth ones replaced those who were left. >From all over the state they came, every race, color and creed. Some staye many years.

From 1886 to 1945 approximately 20,000 children passed through this school. Each has his own story to tell; I myself. My memories are many of a vast, strange place that took me in from poverty's door, housed, clothed, for During these years I fully accepted the State School as a fulfilling home.

As an adult I came to realize the institutional environment did not provide certain needs a child craves, although us physically strong, it left many of us emotionally deficient because emotional staruation is inseparable from its size, individual attention was minimal; consequently, the children suffered from lack of attention, appreciation healthy childhood. For many it left scars, that would last a life time.

The school did provide me with many playmates and friendships that have also lasted a lifetime. I consider all brothers and sisters. Our camaraderie lives in the fact we went through it together.

In my opinion the legacy of the Minnesota State Public School for Dependent and Neglected Children is that, tl generated in a large institution is not conductive to raising emotionally healthy children. Let this memorial fore of that truth, and as a remembrance for every child who passed through these doors and their struggle to overco institution.

* And yet: It was my home and it gave me an identity that set me apart. I've always felt a real sense of pride in School Kid"

Harvey Ronglien --- Ward of the State 1932 - 1943

The center granite monument inscribed in bronze reads:

Owatonna was chosen as the site for the State Public School over eight other proposed sites due to its easy accelocation near the center of most densely populated portion of the state.

At the height of its existence the school housed 500 children in 16 cottages. Other buildings included a nursery, gymnasium, and superintendent, and employee residence. The school had its own power plant, greenhouse, icel complete farm operation with cows, horses, swine and chickens, making it virtually self- sufficient.

The building you are facing was the Main Building and served as the nerve center of the school. Built in 1898 a house the superintendents office, staff offices, reception room, library, chapel, children's and employees dining quarters, and a small boy's living quarters. The upper floors contained living quarters for employees

Many of the other original buildings were demolished, Among those still standing is the hospital, or the white t two buildings southwest of the hospital were boys cottages, each housing 30 children. Each cottage had its own was a large athletic field in back of the school.

The school which contained kindergarten thru the eighth grade, is west of the former boys cottage. Up on comp grade in the early years, some children were selected to be transported to the Owatonna High School.

South of the former school is the gymnasium. The cemetery lies in the southwest corner of the grounds and is v side of the gym.

To the east and below the hill on State Avenue the two brick buildings to the south were also boys cottages. The the receiving cottage where all the children went for admission and a three week quarantine for health reasons.

The farm area stretched out west of the gymnasium and the school and occupied what is now known as the Indhospital was a large apple orchard.

Originally housed on 160 acres, the grounds grew to 329 acres by 1937, with 42 acres for campus and 287 acre

While the intent of the school was not to institutionalize the children, the concept for quick placement in homes children spent their entire childhood at the school. For some it was a traumatic experience; others adjusted mor regimentation of the school. While the exact number of children who died under guardianship is not known, 19 the schools cemetery.

Likewise, some children were indentured into good homes with caring families; others suffered difficult and hu While adoption was the ultimate goal of the State School, adoption rates were low.

By 1945 educators and social agencies realized such children were better served by immediate placement into f State School became an institution for the educable mentally disabled. This school was phased out by June 30 1 unused until 1974 when the Owatonna City Council petitioned the State Department of Administration to buy t buildings for \$200,000. A citizen referendum, voted in favor of the purchase and renovation work began. Today buildings house Owatonna Administration Offices and related city facilities.

Pioneer Settlers' Cemeteries of Steele County, Minnesota

This record of Steele County Minnesota cemetery's was made in an effort to maintain the valuable vital statistic information that is only recorded on the markers as they stand in the individual cemeteries It is very likely that markers have sunk and vanished from the possibility of any record being made from those.

Most of the cemeteries have cemetery boards and have burial records that will be more exacting and more accu attempt to duplicate those records, but to make an easy record that is available to those persons interested in ger work in Steele County Minnesota.

I made a special effort to record the information from the older stone markers that possibly are the only records not attempt to check burial records with actual cemetery burial records as this would involve even a much large extended.

I spent some time in the Steele County Recorders office where several of the cemeteries are recorded from early maps. I added the names of burials mentioned in these surveys in this report when I could.

At this time I have recorded most of the rural cemeteries, except the cemeteries located in church yards except was vital to the earliest settlement records of Bohemian/Czech emigrants to this county and is included with thi

Other church yard cemeteries are also vital as they are associated with the early emigrants of the German's, Nor Danish people that settled in Steele County after 1855. Some of the church yard cemeteries are mostly burials c and the markers are in most cases not in immediate danger of being lost as to the information written on them. 'that were made of the white marble and lime stones that are washing or deteriorating and the information will t

Again some of this information is stored with the individual cemeteries and possibly the Steele County Historic partial record and the Tuttles living in Medford have a very complete record that they have made of the county cards.

This record will be helpful to persons that are tracing families in Steele County Minnesota. I have not attempted cemeteries in the county except the oldest stone markers in Forest Hill in sections 1 and 2 that are very old ston Heart in the front part again mostly the older stones.

St Johns Cemetery located next to Forest Hill is also newer and has mostly second generation Germans settlers original emigrant settlers are buried there also. I am certain the records of this cemetery are well documented. I all these records in a single volume but even getting the records together for these volumes was an enormous ta

I have separated the cemeteries into Nationalities. This is done for the benefit of persons tracing families. As we nationalities. You will find other nationalities (names) in the different cemeteries but you will find that as the can particular nationality, most of the burials in that cemetery will be mostly from that nationality.

Also of course the very earliest settlers in Steele County were the Eastern Americans that came from the East content and places like Ohio. Michigan. Illinois. Iowa, and a lot of these Americans that came from the states and places like Ohio.

The early immigrants coming from other countries did not readily mix with the other nationals and were also rather American settlers they found as their neighbors when they first came to this place. Many have served and came home and lived in the county and now rest in Steele County cemeteri of the service and command they served in. Some were noted as veterans, and many were commemorated by the VFW. in all wars, since the settlement of this county and some veterans served before the county was settled with the migration of the early settlement. Many veterans are found in these records and many are not known.

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Pontoppadan Churchyard Cemetery

Recorded March 24 1987 by Ron Houghtelin of Owatonna, MN

This cemetery is located in Lemond twp in the south part of section 18 on the south side of Steele County Road Lemond at the Pontoppadan Lutheran Church yard. The cemetery is well kept up and maintained.

The cemetery is divided by a paved (blacktop) drive to the rear of the church and then continues with a 10' gras of the cemetery for access.

The section of the cemetery just south of the church building is about 80'X 100' which is active and I recorded south in this area. These rows are about 100' long. A much larger area west of this area has not been used at this

The area that is east of the church and the drive is about 80'X 200' and I recorded 7 burial rows north and south length and the rows average between 11' to 12' in width.

I started recording behind the church and the short row at the west is labeled row 1 and the next row east is row just west of the 10' grass lane. Then east of the drive near the county road begins row 8 and the next row east is 14 at the east side of this area of the cemetery. This method of recording was used to associate families.

The burial markers are recorded from the north to the south in each row. oss is:on the same stone (marker) onp is: on the same plot, umgs is: unmarked grave site. Other information is pretty much self-explanatory.

I have combined the original addition of 1918 for easier reference. I recorded as I read the markers and some were really difficult to read.
